

Preparation Suggestions/Tips For 2022 March for Life Participants

Please arrive at Holy Spirit Church on Thursday, January 20, between 8:00-8:30 pm to sign in, get your bus assignment and handouts. The church has requested that we park in the lower parking lot, away from the main entrance to the church, so please park there for overnight parking. During check-in, Eucharistic Adoration will be occurring in the sanctuary. Please be quiet and respectful and feel free to participate.

There will be a prayer service in the church at 9:00pm. There will be some REQUIRED announcements after the prayer service. We will begin boarding the buses immediately after the announcements, around 9:45pm. Please DO NOT board the buses before being instructed to do so. You will NOT be allowed to board the buses unless a Bus Captain is present, so please do not try to board early. Buses roll at approximately 10:00pm.

You will be traveling to and from Washington on a Bedore Tours bus. Your bus captains will be Gerry Sander (585-503-3256) [Bus 1] and TBD [Bus 2].

Bring a mask. It is REQUIRED inside all Washington DC indoor spaces.

You may want to bring Proof of COVID Vaccination (optional). This is not required for our trip but will be required to enter certain Washington DC businesses and venues.

You will need cash for the following:

- One food stop returning from Washington (Wegman's Market Café)
- Tip for the bus driver (\$5-10 per person)
- You may wish to purchase articles at the Shrine Gift Shop in the lower level.
- Along the March, there will be people with buckets collecting donations for the March for Life.
- If you choose to travel to the Washington Mall via Metro, you will need fare (<\$5)

You may choose to bring snacks or special foods if you have diet restrictions. We will provide granola bars and water on the trip. You may bring snacks to share with other on the bus. Please note that the cafeteria at the Basilica is CLOSED. So, there will be no food available at the Basilica. Food trucks may be available around the Washington Mall.

Be sure to bring any required medicines/prescriptions.

You should bring your cell phone, if you have one. It is the best way to communicate during the March. USE TEXT TO CONTACT ME, NOT PHONE, and put your name in the text. It is difficult to hear phone calls and often there is poor reception with so many people in one place. Cell phone numbers will be recorded by your bus captain when you register for the trip. Electrical outlets are available on the bus, so bring your charging cords and an extra battery. Outlets are limited, so please share. Take photos and use the hashtags #WhyWeMarch on your social media posts.

The buses will have lavatories. Try to use them sparingly, if possible. What goes on the bus, stays on the bus.

The buses are Wi-Fi equipped, but don't expect it to be fast or consistent.

The buses will have DVD players and we will be watching something on the bus. Please bring DVDs, if you want your choice for movie to be considered. Please limit movies to G and PG ratings, as there are many youths on the buses.

You may wish to bring a blanket and pillow for the bus ride. The bus seats can get uncomfortable after many hours, so you may want to bring a cushion upon which to sit. Backpacks are allowed, as the March is on public streets/parks.

It can't hurt to bring your rosary! We will be praying the "Rosary for Life" on the bus.

You should wear comfortable shoes/boots and warm clothing that protects you from cold, snow and or rain. You may also wish to bring along an extra pair of socks. If you get too cold during the March, you can always duck into one of the Smithsonian buildings to get warm (COVID VAX may be REQUIRED to enter)! Hand warmers can be useful.

It's recommended that you dress in layers...and of course bring gloves and a hat. We will provide red and white scarves to most of our participants to make it easier to identify our group. If you have one of these scarves from past years, please bring it with you as we may not have enough for everyone.

Items that you don't wish to carry with you during the March can be left on the bus, but you will not have access to them after drop-off at the Basilica and until pick-up after the march. Drivers are not responsible for lost or stolen items.

You may bring your own signs, home-made or other, but be aware that, once the bus drops us off at the Basilica, you will need to carry them all day. There are many organizations handing out signs at the March.

If you plan on visiting any of the Smithsonian Museums while in the Washington, DC area, please be aware of their security policies found here: <https://www.si.edu/visit/security>. Proof of Vaccination is required to enter after January 15, 2022. Masks are required.

Please Note:

While walking and riding the metro in DC, please be respectful of residents and commuters. Let's show the Nation's Capital how passionate, polite, and respectful pro-lifers really are!

Do not leave trash or signs on the grounds of the National Mall, Supreme Court, or Capitol. This is our Nation's Capital, and we should treat it with dignity and respect. If trash bins are full, please carry your trash or sign with you until you find an available trash bin.

Do not engage with counter protesters. Once again, please be respectful of all people and stay focused on the cause of promoting and celebrating life, lovingly and graciously.

We anticipate arriving back at Holy Spirit around 12-1 am on Saturday, January 22.

Important Information about riding the Metro:

Closest Metro to Basilica is Brookland-CUA Red Line on eastern edge of Catholic U. Tickets available at self-pay kiosks in station. More info at <https://smartrip.wmata.com>

To get to March:

Red Line to VAN NESS-UDC METRO STATION or SHADY GROVE (end of line destination)
Exit at METRO CENTER METRO STATION (can walk from here, exit 12th and F)

OR transfer to

Orange Line to NEW CARROLLTON (end of line destination)
Exit at FEDERAL TRIANGLE METRO STATION on 12th St between Pennsylvania and Constitution
